Committee Reports:

Fundraising:

Vintage Ride – Scheduled for January 29th, 2022. In the event of meager snow, this will not be cancelled as we can ask sled owners to display their vintage sleds on the Unity Common. Fire dept. has been asked to provide a breakfast. Sleds need to be 25 years old. 50/50 raffle will be held during & drawn during breakfast.

Radar Run – Scheduled for February 12, 2022. Detailed layout of grounds & event is required for permit. 660' is typical track length, but it was suggested we file for 800' length in case needed.

Equipment Report:

Tucker – Larry Leclerc reported a busted leaf spring was spotted and replaced during inspection, with a few other minor service items identified.

Trail Report:

- Doug Jeffrey reported that Old Halls Farm (Muellers) stakes, rope, and signs are installed.
- Dave Loring reported that Potato Hill is staked off, old trail ribboned off, and signs moved.
- Two Trail Kiosks constructed courtesy construction by Ron Lemay. One to be installed at Rte. 5 & P399, the second at George's gate.
- Landowner between Jay Phinizy and Ken Gagnons reroute is done.
- New bridge wear bars in on Rte. 5 at the 399. Just needs to have a corner lifted and finish the dirt ramp.
- P399 reroute effort went pretty well. Landowner may be back in there this weekend to excavate some more. 1/10 mile is now 3/4 mile. This is to get around a shooting range. We have built a big horseshoe but at least we still have a trail.
- If the bridge isn't back in alongside of Rte. 10 we will have best east west route.
- On Corridor 6, the Twin Ridge club has regained access to most of the old trail where it crosses Rte. 10 in Goshen south of the store. (Mostly the same trail with a slight reroute.) On the new trail/reroute built last year when this section was closed, the big bridge alongside of Rte. 10 washed out and may not be back in place this season.

Trail Assessments:

- Trails maintained by CLRSR club are all reported to be passable at this time.


More recently, you assisted by helping coordinate the reroute of a small section of trail onto Claremont Beagle Club land. It was a huge win for all parties involved.


